

# OPERATIONAL REPORT **JULY 2023**



### IOM IN PANAMA

For more than 15 years, one of IOM's two Global Administrative Centres has been operating in Panama, as well as the Office of the Special Envoy (OSE) for the Regional Response to the Venezuela Situation and the Country Office or Mission. In total, IOM has 3 offices in Panama City and one sub-office in the Darien province, near the border with Colombia.

IOM Panama has 131 staff members, 94 of which are national and 37 are international officers.

In Panama, the Mission's programmes and projects are implemented in five regions, at more than 10 sites, by 35 staff members who receive administrative and technical support from colleagues from the Administrative Centre and the OSE.

10 people returned voluntarily to their countries of origin or habitual residence with IOM assistance and 14 people were guided on the process.


**OPERATIONS AND EMERGENCIES**
