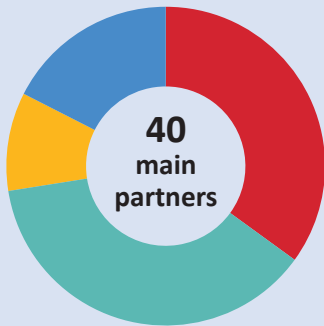

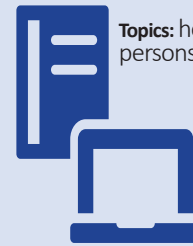


Achievements

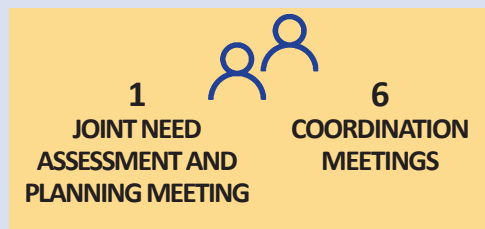

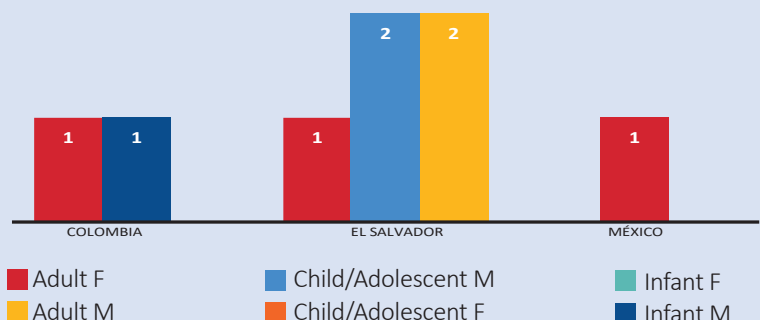
